Old-Fashioned Apple Pie

Easy 15 min Prep 1hr 20 min Cook 8 Servings

An easy delicious apple pie just like grandma used to make.

Ingredients

8 apples medium

2/3 cup sugar

1/4 cup self-raising flour

1/2 tsp ground nutmeg

1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

1 pinch salt

2 tbs butter

2 sheets puff pastry

Method

Heat oven to 220C.

Peel, core and slice the apples, keeping the thickness of slices even.

Mix sugar, flour, nutmeg, cinnamon and salt in a large bowl.

Stir in apples.

Pour into pastry-lined pie plate and dot with butter.

Cover with top crust and seal the edges. Cut slits in the top.

Cover edge with a 5 cm strip of aluminium foil to prevent too much browning.

Cook for 40-50 minutes until juice bubbles through slits.

Remove foil during last 15 minutes of baking.

Wildflowers in Ravensthorpe, Hopetoun and Esperance

Day 1 Home –Bremer (L/D)

Cruise the highway through Boyup Brook and Kojonup, place of the stone axe, head off through Broomhill to Ongerup, "place of the male kangaroo" in the local Noongar language and home to the elusive Yongergnow Malleefowl centre. The name Yongergnow is made up from the Noongar words 'yonger' (male kangaroo) and 'gnow' (Malleefowl). The Centre includes the 'Fowl Play' exhibit that showcases the iconic Malleefowl and its habitat. Immerse yourself in the Mallee bushland surrounding the centre and take a short stroll to the large Mallee bush aviaries. Discover a stunning backdrop of bright, colourful and fascinating wildflowers and plants that grow in the



area as we make our way to Bremer Bay on the south coast. Bremer Bay Motel overnight.

Day 2 Bremer Bay –Hopetoun (B/L/D)

Wellstead Heritage Museum, draws you into the Wellstead Legacy. Early settlers

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laboured tirelessly alongside their countrymen both squires and convicts alike, often enduring extreme adversity to build a collective spirit that would eventually forge our nation. Enjoy a morning tour at Bremer Bay and the delights the area holds for our adventure. Fitzgerald National Park is one of the largest and most botanically significant national parks in Australia. Within the park are found nearly 20 per cent of Western Australia's flora species, many of which occur only within its boundaries. Enjoy the lush surroundings before departing for Hopetoun



named after the first Governor General of Australia, John Hope, 7th Earl of Hopetoun England. Overnight in Hopetoun.

Day 3 Hopetoun – Ravensthorpe (B/D)

A visit to the Wheat Silos and a short tour around town before heading to the Wildflower Show. Free time for you to enjoy the Ravensthorpe Herbarium, situated at the Wildflower Show which holds many hundreds of botanical specimens collected from within the Ravensthorpe Shire. Experts on the local flowers are on hand each day for identification queries. Stop and buy your own lunch, Devonshire tea or warming soup. Browse the many stalls for books, cards, and products that feature the work of local artisans. After lunch a visit to Fitzgerald National Park to view the abundance of wildflowers. Overnight in Hopetoun.

Day 4 Hopetoun – Esperance (B/L/D)
Departing Hopetoun, and travel through the small town of Jedacuttup and Stokes Inlet to Esperance. French explorers are credited with making the first landfall near the present day town, naming it and other local landmarks whilst sheltering from a storm in this area in 1792. The town itself was named after a French ship, the Esperance, commanded by Bruni d'Entrecasteaux. Esperance, is French for 'hope'. We visit Stonehenge on our way to Cape Le Grande National Park. Overnight in Esperance.



Day 5 Esperance (B/D)

We continue our wildflower discovery in and around Esperance with free time for shopping and to buy your own lunch. After lunch a visit to the Esperance Museum, then head out to the wind farm, photograph the pink lakes and take a walk through the Kepwari Wetland, Aboriginal for "place of still waters" and a water bird habitat. Overnight in Esperance.



Day 6 Esperance – Home (B/L)

Farewell to Esperance and home ward bound through the towns of Lake King I named after the Surveyor General of Western Australia, Henry Sandford King, Newdegate, Kukerin to Dumbleyung. The name is of Aboriginal origin, coming from "Dambeling" which possibly means "large lake or inland sea") On December 31, 1964 a crowd gathered on the shores of Lake Dumbleyung to watch English speedster Donald Campbell break a world water speed record. Mr Campbell clocked an incredible 444.71kph across the lake in his bright blue hydroplane, the Bluebird. Travel on through Arthur River to Collie. Enjoy your last afternoon tea with fellow passengers then roll on down the scenic coalfields highway to Bunbury.

On CBH Group grain silos, art tells a story about a people or Join Royal Gala Tours on this unique tour of "Wheat Silo Art" throughout place and the cycle of wildflowers.

This is a creative project transforming country infrastructure into sites of world class mural art.

The silo trail has created murals on grain silos in Northam, Ravensthorpe, Merredin, Albany, Newdegate and Pingrup and on some public walls and transformer boxes throughout Katanning.



Take this opportunity with Royal Gala Tours to learn about the inspiration for the art work, how many litres of pain and how many paint brushes were used and how the artists accessed these difficult locations and visiting many of the small grain growing towns along the way.

Day 1.

Departing via the John Forrest National park, named in honour of WA's first premier we travel through the Avon Valley to Toodyay and Northam to take in our first mural of flying machines, abstract patterns in explosive blocks of Fluoro colour.

Move on through small wheatbelt towns to Merredin meaning "the place of the tree used for spears" in the Aboriginal Language. Overnight in Merredin.

Day 2

The artwork tells the story of Merredin, its environment, diverse community,

landforms and agricultural history. You will travel through small communities to visit Mulka's Cave, Wave Rock, bridal dress museum, miniature soldier museum, wildlife park and the wildflower shop. Farm tour of Wildflowers. Travel through Meckering and Cunderdin.

Overnight in Hyden.



Day 3

The Newdegate silos display art works of western bearded lizard, mallee fowl, thigh spotted frog and red-tailed phascogale on four towering CBH Group silos. The artist, Brenton See took 13 days to complete the artwork.

In the afternoon visit the Ravensthorpe murals consisting of a 25 metre high wildflower inspired mural painted across three silos. Upwards and onwards to Albany. The inspiration for this artwork was from two species of sea horses found in the waters off the South West coast. The Ruby Sea Dragon and the leafy Sea Dragon.

Day 4

Depart via the scenic Porongurup National Park to Pingrup meaning "Place of digging" in the Aboriginal language.

Miami artist Evoca1's 25 metre high artwork, painted on giant grain storage is a tip of the hat to Western Australia's tenacious, resourceful farming communities the silos include scenes drawing threads from the fabric of everyday life in Pingrup, Evoca1's figurative depictions of the town's iconic Pingrup races, its Merino sheep, its people, cattle dogs and even a tractor based precisely on one found on the main street of town, all tell a story about the character of the community. Buy Your Own Lunch in Katanning while viewing the last of the art work trail This exciting new piece of art celebrates the town's industrial beginnings and its significance within the Great Southern/

Wheatbelt in an innovative, contemporary style. All through the town Western Powers transformer boxes have also been "transformed into stunning pieces of art.
